## Towards and inclusive & functional democracy in Africa

As I drafted this letter in late December of 2022 and early January, it was refreshing to know that Nigeria now has a new Electoral Act with Electronic Transmission of Results from polling units to INEC portal now legal and a must, Kenya successfully conducted her General Elections in 2022 without any post-election violence as many feared. The Presidents of 49 countries had just returned from the US after the US-Africa Heads of State Summit in which development of Democracy, Trade, Youth Innovation, Security and Economic Development topped the agenda of discussion.

I am confident to believe that our efforts and overt advocacy that the decline of global democracy as we saw in 2021 was not in anyone's favour is being taken seriously and the need to ensure that emerging next generation of young African leaders understand economics and trade as a key ingredient of democratic sustainability. And oh...lest I forget, South Africa's Cyril Ramaphosa just won the election to lead the ANC for another 5 years despite his farmgate scandal and our brother Ghana has declared to us all that he is broke. Mali, Guinea, Sudan and Chad are still under military dictatorships.



I nevertheless begin 2023 with both tremendous appreciation for what we accomplished in 2022 during the advocacy for electoral reforms in Nigeria and great optimism about the year ahead. I expect that, over the course of 2023, these gains experienced in Nigeria and Kenya will help the rest of Africa to rediscover that there is still gold in democratically run societies which works in everyone's favour. As more of our society makes that shift towards inclusive and functional democracy, we will be able to see rapid social development and increased participation of citizens in the political process.

In 2022, ReadyToLeadAfrica expanded its on the ground impact across Nigeria in partnership with INEC, NYSC, NVDC and our media partners. We increased the number of registered voters in Abia State, contributed to the establishment of the National Voters Drive Coalition, the PVC distribution support program in Lagos State, the PVC distribution support program in Kano State as well as an ADRI report on the state of democracy in Kenya.

We also improved our partnership building goals which saw us formalize partnerships with institutions such as the National Youth Service Corps NYSC, the Nigeria Governor's Forum, the Open Society Foundations OSF, whilst also beginning the process of formal partnership with institutions like LEAP Africa (NYFF) the European Union, the African Union Youth Envoy Office, USADF, the UN-SDG Office in Nigeria and the UN HQ in New York USA.

I am grateful to every member of our board, staff and leaders of our state chapters for the tenacity, resilience, capability, and pride that you have demonstrated as we came together not merely to push through this long ordeal, but to sustain and build upon ReadyToLeadAfrica's mantra of Ours is to PLOUGH, Not to PLUNDER.

As 2023 begins, we will focus on delivering the #FollowTheResult project in the 2023 elections in Nigeria, #FollowThePromises on campaign promises across 6 states in Nigeria for public accountability, National Youth Peace Dialogue Project in partnership with the NYSC and the Signing of the Youth Peace Accord (YAEVA) to promote peace. We will also pursue African wide programs that facilitate trade amongst Africa's young populations through our #ReadyToTRADE initiatives.

We can anticipate new beginnings, new growth opportunities to greater heights, and even new dimensions to our mission to PLOUGH and Not PLUNDER Africa.

# COMEDY CONCERT MEETS CIVIC ENGAGEMENT - LAUNCH OF READYTOVOTECAMPAIGN

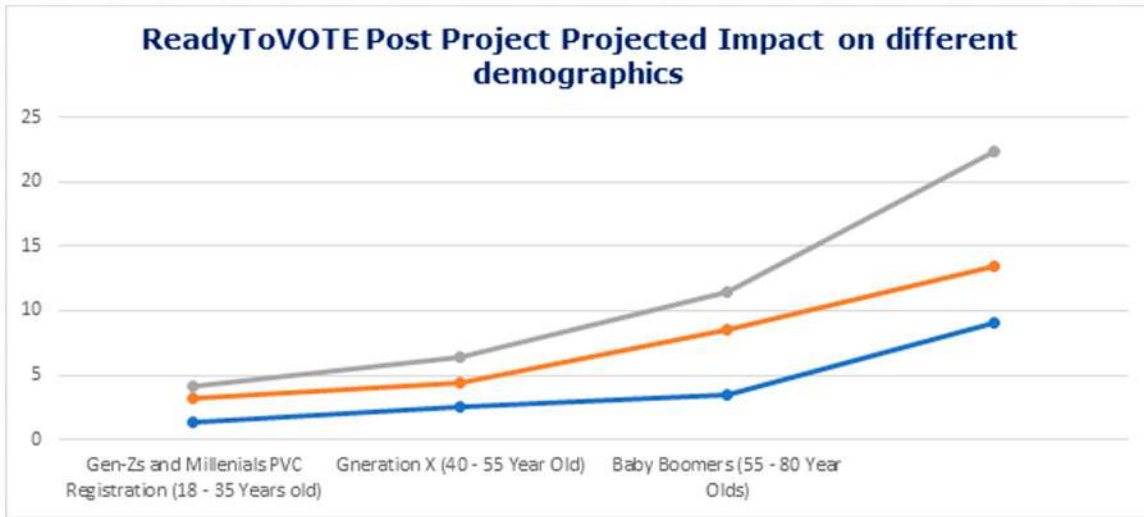
ReadyToLeadAfrica in partnership with the Nigerian Physician Advocacy Group NPAG implemented the ReadyToVOTE initiative in partnership with the Alibaba January 1st Comedy Concert. The ReadyToVOTE initiative implementation strategy using the connection of comedy and healthcare was arrived at as a way to celebrate the efforts of healthcare professionals during the 2020 Covid-19 pandemic whilst also encouraging Nigerians to register to get their permanent voters cards PVCs.

## Project Impact

Upon implementation of the project by ReadyToLeadAfrica, we were able to reach over 3000 physical attendees at the concert venue with the message of how important it is to get their PVCs as Nigerians. The online impact of the ReadyToVOTE project was also very obvious as over 1 million people both in Nigeria and in the diaspora saw the reported videos on all our social media as well as that of NPAG.

We were also able to enlist A-List comedians such as Alibaba, Kenny Blaq, Josh2Funny, MC Abey, MC Lively, Wolie Arole, Chigurl, Yaw of Wazobia Fm, Lapacious Bose, Saco and Kelechi Amadi the legendary photographer and others as ambassadors for the message of citizens participation in the political process by ensuring they register to vote on election day.

## READYTOLEADAFRICA CELEBRATES PASSAGE AND SIGNING INTO LAW OF ELECTORAL REFORMS BILL 2022

In February of 2022, after over 2 years of consistent advocacy efforts, President Muhammadu Buhari signed the Electoral Act 2022 into law as the country watched on with high hopes. This act alone sets a new legal and much anticipated improved framework for the conduct of elections in Nigeria. The drafting of the law and its passage by the National Assembly and its eventual signing by President Buhari represents a crucial outcome of our ReadyToLeadAfrica #YouthMarchForth & #HonorJune12 projects with the support of NPAG, the GIGM group, Transcorp Hilton and others.

Under this project, we engaged election stakeholders such as lawmakers, INEC officials and other critical stakeholders through various workshops and held youth marches across Nigeria and the FCT to impact the final outcome of the law. We also engaged with lawmakers at their constituency offices levels to encourage them to pass the bill to ensure the 2023 elections increases its overall credibility, transparency and acceptability



## READYTOLEADAFRICA LED THE EFFORTS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL VOTERS DRIVE COALITION (NVDC)

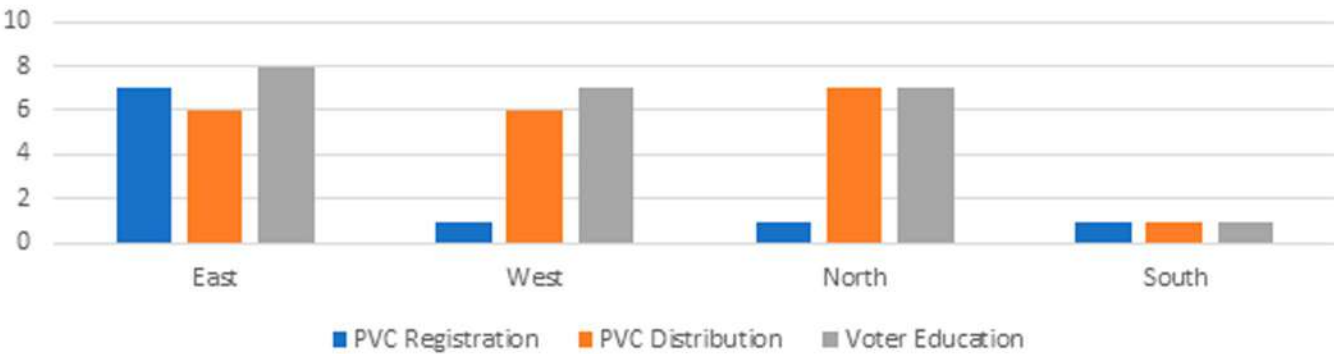
ReadyToLeadAfrica as a founding member and local implementing partner led the initial establishment engagements of the NVDC Coalition to INEC Nigeria as part of the coalition's drive to support voter's education and democratic participation across Nigeria.

The NVDC is a coalition of both Nigerian based NGOs and US based NGOs owned by Nigerians in the Diaspora committed to the promotion of democracy, civic participation and credible elections initiatives. The NVDC has so far implemented voter's registration, education and PVC distribution support projects in partnership with INEC in Abia, Lagos and Kano states respectively. The NVDC will expand to other states by January of 2023 with plans already at advanced stages.

## READYTOVOTE PVC REGISTRATION PROJECT IN ABIA STATE (FEBRUARY - MAY 2022)

The ReadyToVOTE – Sorom Tuo ABIA Project implemented by ReadyToLeadAfrica as lead organization in partnership with the Progressive Abia Youth organization as implementing partners and INEC Abia State was designed to increase the PVC registration levels in Abia State as well as improve the numbers of actual voters on election day come 2023.

The project in Abia state also included a free Healthcare Screening exercise for the voters in all the 17 LGAs of Abia State. We implemented the project working with over 130 youths from the 17 LGAs in the state.

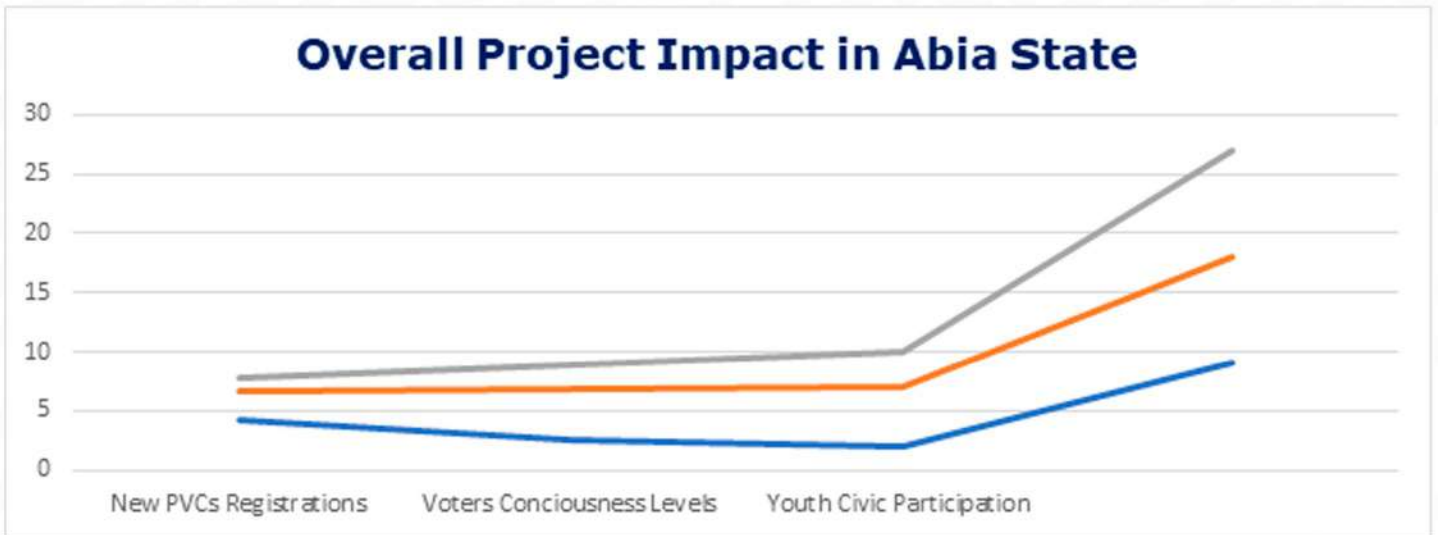
### **ReadyToVOTE Project Impact**

At the end of the PVC registration phase in Abia State, we recorded over 75,000 new registrations for PVCs and over 40,000 medical screening for the people of Abia.



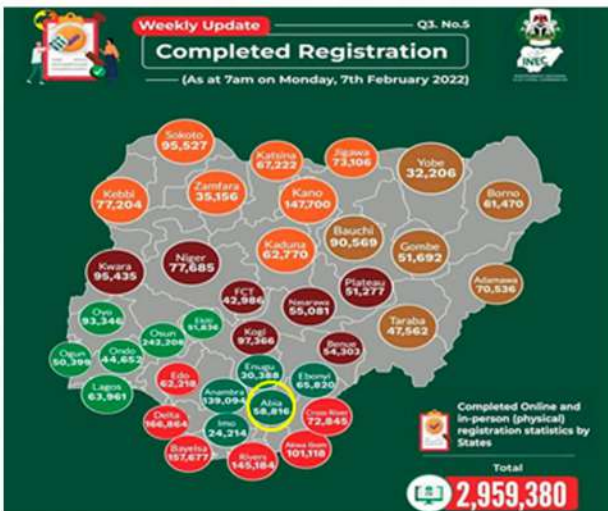


## ReadyToVOTE Project Impact on PVC Registrations in Abia State 2022

We became an officially registered CSO with INEC HQ Abuja as part of our efforts to deepen our relationship with key stakeholders in Nigeria as we work on advocacy projects and reforms designed to improve Nigeria's democracy. We successfully went through the process and was officially certified as an NGO that INEC partners with in Nigeria.

As part of our efforts to further expand our global footprints and play a bigger role in the preservation, protection and promotion of Democracy, we visited the US State Department in Washington DC to discuss practical solutions on how reverse the negative trend of shrinking civic space in Nigeria and Africa in General. Our Global President, Godbless Otubure met with Weston, Sonya D in charge of the Nigerian Desk to discuss the 2023 elections, the youth awakening and the future of Africa-US relations and how it is critical for young people to play key roles in shaping the future of democracy on the continent.

As partners to the Nigerian Physician Advocacy Group (NPAG) USA which is an arm of ANPA, ReadyToLeadAfrica was invited to the annual general meeting in Charlotte North Carolina to interact with Nigerians in Diaspora on the ongoing work that RTLA and NPAG has been working on and plans to execute for the near future.



## **Engagement at the UN HQ New York on Promoting Democracy, Peace Building, Youth Inclusion & the SDGs**

As part of our commitment at ReadyToLeadAfrica to increase our global engagement quotient and share our ReadyToVOTE, KeepersOfDemocracy Initiative and our Youth Against Electoral Violence Accord, we engaged stakeholders at the United Nations so as to establish a working relationship with the UN as we work to protect, preserve and promote democracy globally.

Represented by our Global President, we held a few meetings with members of staff of the SDGs office at the UN HQ and engaged other global leaders and institutions such as the Business Council on International Understanding (BCIU) on Peace Building Initiatives as well as the UN University of Peace Initiative. We engaged the Legislative, Peace and Inclusive Security department to also work on the National Youth Peace Dialogue NYPD project which was well received by the NGF.

### **Impact of the Partnership**

As a result of this partnership, the NGF has supported ReadyToLeadAfrica in engaging the 36 states Governors on the need to nominate youths from their states to participate at the official launch of the NYPD and the signing of the Youth Peace Accord in 2023

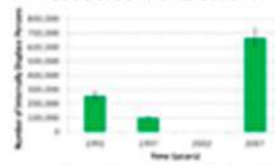


FIGURE 2 The number of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) rose as a result of election violence in 2017 after decline in previous Kenyan elections. Source: National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, 2015.

Figure 3. Deaths Associated with Elections

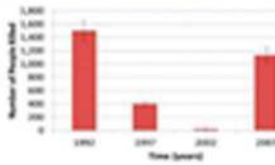


FIGURE 3 Deaths associated with the 2017 election in Kenya rose after election in the previous two elections. Source: National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, 2015.

workers who typically occupy the informal sector, and the 'dynasty' political families like the Odingas, Kenyattas, and more (Juma and Campbell). According to experts, this is a cunning effort by Deputy President Ruto to reform 'identity politics' in Kenya. It testifies to rising dissatisfaction with the government, especially when coupled with the limitations that have had such a negative impact on the livelihoods of the numerous young people who rely on the informal economy. The epidemic has also fueled the corruption that permeates all parts of Kenyan public life, creating the 'COVID millionaires' and enhancing the attraction of the 'hustle/identity' storyline.

## Contemporary Contexts

Beside from post-election volatility, there are other political and social problems in contemporary Kenya. In March 2018, a handshake between President Uhuru Kenyatta and opposition leader, Raila Odinga, was intended to end many months of post-election violence. However, it also facilitated the



formation of the Building Bridges Initiative, a proposed program focused on laying the foundation for peace and reconciliation by ending historical and electoral abuses and uniting Kenyan citizens. The BBB process resulted in a report released in October 2020 that advocated amending numerous sections of Kenya's constitution to address concerns of political inclusion and electoral integrity (Juma and Campbell). The deal, however, was met with immediate criticism by minority parties and opposition individuals who claimed that it irreversibly disadvantaged them by consolidating power in the hands of a small political elite (Ibid).

## Analysis

### Post Election Violence

The issue of violence is front of mind for the public as Kenya prepares for the elections in 2022. The polarization of political parties and violence along racial lines has been most disturbing. This has been witnessed in the most recent elections between the Luo and the incumbents in power, who are ethnically Kikuyu or Kalenjin. Due to the absence of Kikuyu candidates in this election, the dynamics have substantially shifted (Ibid). The candidates should reach a consensus on the rules. The leading candidates, Odinga and Ruto, as well as the current president, Kenyatta, will need to act wisely given their influence over the electorate. Public declarations by the leading candidates to accept the results of an election, preferably made together, have helped to significantly reduce tensions and calm public anxiety in controversial elections.

The RTLA FollowTheRESULT initiative is our Tech-Driven platform to report the approved election results by the Election Management Body directly to citizens during the 2023 elections as a way to promote transparency and the integrity of the electoral process



The RTLA FollowThePROMISES initiative is our Tech-Driven platform to track the implementation progress of key election promises made by candidates during electioneering period. The FTP relies on Participant Observatory Strategy to deliver unbiased assessment of government programs



The RTLA NYPD seeks to promote and implement the RTLA-Methodical Approach to Peace Building Initiative, which will be driven by NYSC Corps Members, to achieve peaceful coexistence amongst Nigerians – whilst also serving as a conflict prevention initiative in urban and grassroots communities.



The RTLA NYPS (National Youth Peace Symbol) is a by-product of the NYPD. The NYPS will serve as the peace emblem for young people in Nigeria as we work to restore peace to troubled communities across Nigeria and Africa.
